BULGARIAN FOLK CHOREOGRAPHY EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION DEGREE: BACHELOR OF PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATION: CHOREOGRAPHER-TEACHER

TERM OF STUDY: 4 YEARS

"Bulgarian folk choreography" is a broad profile specialty, forming the basic training for the profession of choreographer-pedagogue and harmonizing with the market conditions in which the young specialist can be realized.

The specialty "Bulgarian Folk Choreography" at SWU "Neofit Rilski" - Blagoevgrad has existed since 1997. She is the successor of the specialty "Choreographic Pedagogy", which has existed since 1992.

With a decision of the AC of SWU "N. Rilski" from 18.12.1991 the specialty "Choreographic pedagogy" was opened, which began to accept students by state order, full-time and part-time education in the academic year 1991/92. Subsequently, it was renamed "Bulgarian Folk Choreography" and was included in the state register of specialties in higher education / SG No. 8 / with Decree No. 4 of 14.01.1998 for the adoption of NEDI for higher education in the specialty "Bulgarian Folk Choreography". choreography "from professional field 8.3. "Music and dance art".

The training is aimed at creating specialists in "Bulgarian folk choreography" with high professional qualifications, able to realize the knowledge and skills acquired during the study to solve artistic and creative tasks, pedagogical, research and theoretical activities and choreographic criticism. It is a unique specialty that provides the construction of a new type of artists, combining high professionalism as a choreographer and educator. This determines its place in the university structure, in addition to the national scale and in the geographical region of Southeast Europe.

Mastering the achievements in the theory and practice of contemporary Bulgarian art, based on the traditions, experience and achievements of the most prominent Bulgarian artists, choreographers, musicians, artists, ethnographers, culturologists and others. to the invaluable richness of the Bulgarian music and dance folklore, the future specialists will find their personal and authorial presence and creative realization by creating new highly artistic author's choreographic works.

Along with this, the specialist graduate of "Bulgarian Folk Choreography" is prepared to conduct a proper scientifically and methodologically sound educational process in dance art in the education system. In his pedagogical activity, he will find support in the use of various methodological and didactic principles, as well as in the knowledge and skills acquired in the choice of elective subjects during the study set in the curriculum of the specialty, in the field of sports dances, classical dance and the dances of the peoples.

Others will direct the realization of their knowledge in research and theoretical activities for the enrichment of the underdeveloped choreographic theory and criticism in Bulgaria, which lags significantly behind the bright achievements in practice for the stage and artistic transformation of folk dance heritage.

This specialty is in line with the state policy for the creation of specialists with a bachelor's degree to harmonize education with the European realities in higher education and the market conditions in which the future specialist must be realized.

The main thing that distinguishes our specialty from similar ones in other higher education institutions is embedded in the very concept of the curriculum. The training is conducted on the basis of Bulgarian folk dances, but together with them the subjects are studied with sufficient hours: Sports dances, Classical dances and Dances of the peoples, which gives them the opportunity to choose one of the proposed types of dances as electives. This gives them the opportunity to be realized as broad-profile specialists in the field of choreography.

Graduates of the specialty receive higher education with a professional qualification "Choreographer-pedagogue" of the educational qualification degree "Bachelor".

The specialist who graduated in "Bulgarian Folk Choreography" can be realized

such as:

1 Choreographer, leader and organizer of professional and amateur

groups, children's dance groups and ensembles at community centers, houses of culture, private dance groups, youth dance studios, clubs, etc.

- 2. Teacher of "Bulgarian folk dances and dance art" in the education system. Teacher and methodologist in dance art in schools and centers for children's creativity and art.
- 3. Specialist-methodologist in dance art at municipal and regional commissions for education and culture.
- 4. Head of a club / methodologist / to homes for children and adolescents, holiday resorts, hotels, etc.

The mission of the specialty "Bulgarian Folk Choreography" is the training of staff with high professionalism and a wide range of achievements in the field of choreography and education.

This mission of the specialty is carried out through the following educational, artistic, research and cultural goals:

- training of choreographers and pedagogues with higher education, corresponding to the development of the society and the constantly improving educational system;
- implementation of modern broad-based and humanitarian education, creating in choreographers and dance teachers a desire for continuous self-improvement, self-education and self-regulation;
 - building professional and personal qualities, artistic and creative and research competence, providing the strategy for independent learning and professional responsibility;
- development and realization of active forms and methods of education, corresponding to the modern achievements in choreography, ethnochoreology and pedagogy, guaranteeing the necessary volume of knowledge and skills for the fast realization and adaptation of the specialists to the requirements of the modern culture and art.

The goals of the specialty "Bulgarian Folk Choreography" formulated in this way correspond to the Mission and Strategy for Development of the Southwestern University "Neofit Rilski", as well as to the latest trends in the development of choreographic and pedagogical science. They also

correspond to the public expectations regarding the importance of the musical-choreographic education of the younger generation.

The discipline Characteristic Dances is aimed at studying the characteristic dances of different nationalities that are part of the structure of the ballet performance. The studied dances of different

nationalities are stylized according to the rules of classical dance - Russian, Russian Gypsy, Italian, Hungarian, Spanish, Eastern style, Georgian and European forms transferred to the folk dances of Russia - quadrille. Students get acquainted with the characteristic exercise and study its specifics and features. The program is designed for full-time students. The course enriches the dance culture of future choreographers, cultivates the performing arts and indirectly supports and develops the imagination as well as skills for working with different national dance material. Annotation:

The study of the discipline builds in the student knowledge and skills, both for the accurate recording of the dance movements and for the recording of the spatial-compositional arrangement of the dancers. In addition, it can record any additional explanations of the content and form of the dance, the characteristics of the individual characters and any other data on the construction of the overall drama of the dance.

The lecture course includes - the study of descriptive systems in choreographic practice and their application. Recording the imagery of the elements of dance movements. Save the dance pattern. Forming the overall structure of a recorded dance (Annotation of the dance, Description of the movements, Description of the dance, Application of the music to the dance).

1. Dance systems in choreographic practice - 1 hour.

- 2. Determining the individual elements of dance movements and the connections between them 1 hour.
- 3. Rhythmic scheme of dance movements 1 hour
- 4. Determining and recording the durations of the elements of the dance movements 1 hour
- 5. Recording the imagery of the elements of dance movements 1 hour
- 6. Recording the dance drawing 1 hour.
- 7. Forming the overall structure of a recorded dance / Annotation of the dance, Description of the movements, Description of the dance, Application of the music to the dance
- 8. Methodology of reading and placing a dance according to the description 1 hour
- 9 Reading an unknown dance text 1 hour.
- 10 Reading the drawing of a described dance 1 hour
- 11 Reading and placing a dance fragment / dance figure / from a described dance 1 hour.
- 12 Complete reading and dancing according to the description 4 hours.

Training and assessment technology:

Evaluation of the results achieved in the training process is in accordance with the requirements of Ordinance №21 of the Ministry of Education and Science of September 30, 2004 on the implementation of a system for accumulation and transfer of loans. The total credit of the course is 2 credits. Half of the credit is raised from classroom employment, and the other half is obtained from independent extracurricular (EIA) work.
