Program Description

The "Acting for film and television" program's goal is to prepare skilled professionals for film and TV productions. After the course is complete the students will graduate with a Master degree.

The educational course was designed to give students theoretical and practical knowledge about specifics of the work in TV station such as news reader, host of show program, or voice-talent that records voice-overs for documentaries or scientific and educational films. The course prepares its participants for creation of privately owned casting agencies that recruit and manage extras, character actors and voice-talents for film and TV productions.

The students acquire theoretical knowledge about film and television and improve their practical skills as actors or actresses for the camera. These skills are necessary when an actor or an actress:

- takes a part in a film or a TV production
- auditions for a part in feature film, TV drama or sitcom
- records voice-overs for news, documentaries or corporative projects
- creates own casting agency and manages other people's career development
- should work as a part of a creative team
- should act in accord with film set etiquette

The program's theoretical courses are on academical level as a requirement of the educational degree. The program creates opportunities for scientific research in the Humanities field and especially Film and Television Cultural Studies.

The Program's Mission

To educate highly professional and competitive actors and actresses and give them skills to navigate a career in ever changing world of film and television. To implement theoretical and practical courses that are up to date and are organized around the understanding of modern day requirements for career in Film and TV.

To use modern educational methods and various forms of control and testing students' progress with clear focus on their improvement as professional actors or actresses.

To guide lectors and students scientific research in direction of spotting, understanding and solving real problems of practical quality for the job.

ACTING IN SCREEN ARTS 1

ECTS credits: 6,0

Examination: Practical Task

Semester: I

Methodological Guidance: Department of Television, Theater and Cinema Art;

Annotation:

The course introduces acting technique's main concepts, creates understanding of filmic space and teaches mastering of meaningful and multidimensional characters. Main differences between film and television are taught. Creation of visual face of the character through use of relative shot sizes, through use of rhythm. Skills for artistic interpretation.

Course Content:

This theoretical and practical course is organized around the knowledge and skills that are needed for basic understanding and practice of actor's profession – building of aesthetical taste, culture and style, methods and possibilities of the creative process, basic techniques and tools like timing and space, acting and staging.

Methodology of Education and Examination:

The evaluation of students' progress is based on their class work and their ability to carry on their theoretical and practical tasks and exercises. Theoretical tasks could be writing of short paper analyzing a screenplay, short story, or feature film and elaborating on modern technological or cultural themes.

Practical tasks and exercises are individual and in groups and often are conducted with the students from the other programs of Film and TV Department. The tasks are given by the lecturer of every course and are closely supervised during their completion.

Actor's Movement in Film

Annotation:

The course introduces the main concepts relevant to the physical movement of the players in a film shot and in a film scene. Students learn timing and mis-en-scene, acting according to the relative shot sizes, details and accents.

Course Content:

Theoretical and practical aspects of the course are organized on the idea that students must acquire basic elements that build up their plasticity, their acting in foreground and background of the shot, their ability to communicate with other actors and crew members and interpret the acting techniques used in film and television productions.

Methodology of Education and Examination:

The course is aimed at acquiring practical knowledge and professional competence needed for work in Film and TV.

The evaluation is based on students' progress during their practical exercises and performance in class.

Practical tasks and exercises are individual and in groups and often are conducted with the students from the other programs of Film and TV Department. The tasks are given by the lecturer of every course and are closely supervised during their completion.

Annotation:

The course teaches basic understanding of the dramatic rules and tools, their origin and development. Students should know how to find and analyze the dramathurgical roots of the film parts.

Course Content:

The course introduces students to Aristoteles' Poetics and the structural forms of tragedy – fear, empathy, catharsis. Types of plotting. Origin and development of Greek drama, main authors – Aeschylus, Sophocles, Euripides. Modern interpretation of the ancient Greek drama. Ways of adaptation and modernization. Internal and external conflict. Types of conflicts and tools for their visualization.

Students have to know and understand the aesthetic qualities of the film shot. This knowledge articulates an ability to properly visualize artistic messages in accord with film aesthetics.

The evaluation is based on students' progress during their practical exercises and performance in class.

To translate all the theoretical knowledge on practical grounds and introduce students to work in the environment of big and diverse film crew.

Course Content:

Students have to complete numerous tasks about search for thematic center of a project, casting of appropriate persons for specific roles, field research for characters of documentary projects.

Students discuss the specifics of their tasks with the lecturer and choose methods and techniques of accomplishment and possible problems on actual field work. Practice consist of different stages – script preparation, field research of characters and settings including test photography of the subject and shooting script preparation.

Special and Visual effects are designed to enhance film experience, to focus attention on certain details and hide others, the stir the imagination creating new worlds on the screen. The course overviews modern day technologies and processes that create visual illusion on cinema and TV screens. New directions are shown in development of film and digital technologies not only for the VFX, but for the whole realm of audio-visual projects. Theoretical data are illustrated with numerous examples of lecturer's work in Bulgarian and international productions.

Film, video and digital image – differences and similarities of technological process. Outline of digital cinema methods. Multi exposure – basic principles of work in film and television. Differences and similarities. Visual effects through exposure of parts of the shot. Titles over static or moving image. Secondary exposure of animation, lightning bolts, flames. Creation of cosmic space and night sky with stars in film through CGI. Overlapping of two images with different optical axis.

The Curriculum for Master Degree Program "Acting for Film and Television"

Includes 675 hours of mandatory, optional, facultative and practical lectures and exercises. During the academic year students study 17 courses – 9 mandatory, 5 optional and 1 mandatory practice.

The theoretical courses provide skills and knowledge for:

- educational basis and individual development of the future film and TV actor
- forming proper attitude towards the profession
- building up skills needed for work as an actor in film and television
- possible work in the field in Humanities and Film and TV research

The special courses provide knowledge and skills for:

- broad professional competence
- working in international and Bulgarian film and TV productions
- adaptiveness in the demanding field of audio-visual project
- working with the latest technologies and processes in film and television

Graduation

The education of academic degree – master's degree completes with state final certification examination – thesis defence.

Organization and holding of the state final exams – the thesis defences are consistent with the Reference Book for the structure and organization of the educational process of SWU "Neofit Rilski", Blagoevgrad.

The thesis defence contains two parts – finished film or tv production and written theoretical part – account on the thesis film. This form of defence is established in the curriculum of the subject and developed in the demands for graduation.

The assignation of the thesis goes under order and conditions determined by the Reference book of the educational activities in SWU.
